



Bannockburn High School is committed to supporting Fairtrade wherever possible.

"Fairtrade is about guaranteeing a better deal for producers in the developing world"

The school will support Fairtrade in the following ways:

1. Support the fair-trade steering group
 - a. Fairtrade Steering Group meetings will be included in the school calendar (one each term)
 - b. Membership of the Steering Group will be offered as a Committee option to S6 pupils
 - c. Membership will be offered to any pupils in S1-5 who attend the Fairtrade Lunch Group
 - d. A member of the senior management team will be a member of this steering group and this will be included on their remit
 - e. An annual invitation will be made to catering services to send a representative

2. Ensure fairtrade is part of the school development plan
 - a. The rector should consider fairtrade when designing the development plan
 - i. Enterprise
 - ii. Citizenship
 - iii. A Curriculum for Excellence

3. Pupils achievements in promoting Fairtrade will be rewarded
 - a. Fairtrade Achievement Certificates should be awarded to pupils involved in organising Fairtrade Events at the end of year award ceremony's
 - b. Comment should be made in the school newsletter after each fairtrade event.
 - c. Pupils who attend the fairtrade lunch group should be awarded house points

4. Use Fairtrade products whenever possible
 - a. Attempt to provide fairtrade products in the staffroom
 - b. Attempt to use fairtrade products in Home Economics whenever possible (especially during fairtrade awareness week)
 - c. An annual request for fairtrade products to be used in school meals should be made to catering services.
 - d. Attempts should be made to ensure after school events use fairtrade products

- e. Physical Education should attempt to source fairtrade equipment whenever possible
5. *Explore using uniforms made with fairtrade cotton*
- a. *Enquiries to be made with Logo Express regarding this issue*
 - b. *Consultation with parents and pupils*
6. Ensure learning about fairtrade happens in a range of lessons and in whole school activities
- a. Fairtrade events should be included in the school calendar - one each term
 - b. Fairtrade week should be calendared for 1st week in March
 - c. Promotion of Fairtrade issues should be included on at least 3 departmental development plans
 - d. Fairtrade Steering Group and lunch group will be responsible for planning events
 - e. Probationary Teachers should be offered an opportunity to get involved
7. Promote Fairtrade within the School and wider community
- a. A fairtrade lunch group will be offered to pupils
 - b. Posters should be displayed throughout the school
 - c. Fairtrade Group should ensure each form class in S1 and S2 has a poster
 - d. There will be a fairtrade section in Inform each week highlighting fairtrade products and the issues surrounding fairtrade
 - e. One event to be held each term
 - f. One event should include the wider community e.g. Christmas concerts, school shows or parents evenings
